# **Bv Train**

The Mole Vanvitelliana is approximately a 15-minute walk (1 km) from Ancona railway station, heading towards the city centre. Once you reach the Quartiere degli Archi area, the Mole Vanvitelliana complex will be on your left in the port area. Alternatively, you can take an urban bus from the station heading towards the city centre and get off near the Mole Vanvitelliana.

ANCONA - MOLE VANVITELLIANA - 11 APRILE - 15 GIUGNO

The exhibition Rinascimento marchigiano: Restored works of art from the earthquake-affected areas along the paths of faith, curated by Stefano Papetti and Pierluigi Moriconi, focuses on the enhancement and promotion of the historical and artistic heritage from churches and museums in towns impacted by the 2016-17 earthquakes (in the southern Marche region) and the November 2022 earthquake (in the provinces of Pesaro Urbino and Ancona).

The works on display, all restored by experts from the Marche region, are of notable historical and artistic significance and are presented in three distinct sections, arranged chronologically.

The first section, dedicated to medieval works, features grand wooden crucifixes, including a remarkable example with relief on a shaped cross and a starry blue sky, created for the early Christian church of the Most Holy Saviour in Ancona (now Santi Pellegrino e Teresa, following 18th-century renovations). This 13th-century crucifix belongs to the Christ Triumphant (Christus Triumphans) type, similar to the one from Matelica, which is also on display.

The second section is devoted to Renaissance painting: alongside works by Carlo Crivelli, Antonio Vivarini, Pietro Alamanno and Cola dell'Amatrice, one of the masterpieces by Lorenzo d'Alessandro is featured. The painting depicting the *Virgin Mary* and *child enthroned between Saints Anne, Roch and Sebastian* (second half of the 15th century) is housed in the Museo Piersanti in Matelica, but originally came from the now-demolished Church of San Michele Arcangelo.

The exhibition concludes with a third section dedicated to 17th-century works, including pieces by Ludovico Trasi, Giuseppe Puglia (known as Il Bastaro), and Saint Charles Borromeo in Glory with Saints (1625 - 1630) by Cesare Dandini (1596 -1657, Florence). This large oil painting, from the Church of the Most Holy Sacrament in Ancona, is one of the highlights of the exhibition.

#### THE MOLE VANVITELLIANA

In conjunction with the exhibition, here is what the Mole Vanvitelliana has to offer:

Luigi Vanvitelli's legacy in the port of Ancona: a true masterpiece of architecture and engineering on water, the Mole Vanvitelliana is a lazaretto designed by Luigi Vanvitelli and built between 1733 and 1743. It stands on a pentagonal artificial island within the port area; today, it is connected to the mainland by three bridges and covers an area of 20,000 m<sup>2</sup>. It is the starting point of Ancona's Grand Tout Vanvitelliano (www.anconatourism.it).

Homer Tactile State Museum: a unique, barrier-free space where everyone can engage with art through touch, the Homer Tactile State Museum is an international model for accessibility culture and the aesthetic education of blind and partially sighted people. The museum houses over 200 works and currently on display at the museum is "L'ombra vede" (The shadow sees), an exhibition by the artist Enzo Cucchi (www.museoomero.it).

Design Collection: located within the Mole Vanvitelliana, this space is designed in keeping with the philosophy of the Homer Museum, offering a multisensory experience where visitors can explore 32 iconic pieces of Italian design that have either been mentioned or awarded the prestigious Compasso d'Oro (www.museoomero.it).

Visit to the walkways of the Mole Vanvitelliana: visitors have the unique opportunity to ascend the external walkways of the Mole, offering a spectacular view of the city.

The Mole - Literary Café: visitors can also indulge in a coffee break, lunch or aperitif while immersing themselves in the adventures of a good book (www.themoleancona.it).

**Exhibitions and Events:** the Mole Vanvitelliana serves as a venue for cultural, musical, performing arts events and film screenings. Its spaces host various exhibitions and are available for conferences and congresses.
